MINUTES

1. Chair Updates, Chair Romano

- Quorum
 - Try to be responsive to reply to Courtney's email
 - Responsibilities to reply to Courtney, show up to meetings, and assist with the events
- Testimony & policy
 - Did not have testimony prepared ahead of time this week was particularly challenging for Caroline and others, so think ahead for anyone who wants to be a Chair in the future; leadership roles need more dedication and reliability
 - Caroline wrote the testimony in the parking lot pulled together information about period products, including about Virginia budget \$250,000 amendment for period products for schools; got stripped from the budget last-minute; spoke re: the cost of period products and menopause \$6-16/month is average spent by women and girls on period products. Recommended putting in libraries, all facilities, and recreation centers. Lynchburg City Schools says about \$4,000 per year, treat like restroom supplies (i.e. toilet paper). Coin-operated period products machine upstairs in the county building absurd, no one has coins for parking much less period products. Chair Libby Garvey enthusiastically said, all County buildings should absolutely have period products.
 - Discussed necessity for public restrooms throughout Arlington
 - For next time: write ahead of time, look at budget summary pages, reach out to partner organizations and see what their priorities are
