Opening

Established in 1918 and initially known as the Halls Hill Volunteer Fire Department, Fire Station 8 has left a legacy in Arlington as the only station staffed by an all-black, volunteer unit for decades during segregation.


- July 2016: The County Board accepted the Fire Station No. 8 Task Force's recommendation to build a new, four-bay station at its existing location (4845 Langston Blvd.)
- January 2018: The Fire Station No. 8 History and Legacy working group was established to recommend strategies for honoring the Hall's Hill/High View Park Volunteer Fire Department
- December 2021: Completion of the temporary fire station at 2211 N. Culpeper St.
- June 2022: Demolition of the existing Fire Station 8 completed
- Early 2024: Estimated Fire Station completion

New Fire Station No. 8 Design and Features




- State of the art public safety facility with designated decontamination zone
- 20,500 ft² building with three stories and four drive-through apparatus bays
- Energy efficient: Green roof, solar panels,
 LEED silver certified
- Improved living areas
- History and legacy informational displays in the lobby and by the sidewalks

The temporary fire station opened in December 2021.




- Temporary fire station built in first phase of the project.
- Existing house repurposed to provide living quarters for firefighters.
- Membrane structure built to house two apparatus bays.

The demolition phase began with hazmat removal in December 2021 and January 2022.



The building demolition was completed in June 2022.








Removal of two fuel tanks in September 2022.








Construction of new building began in August 2022 with infill of old basement with soil.






Preparation for concrete footings (I) and laying of masonry foundation walls and installation of underground piping (r) began in August 2022.






Installation of conduit for the electrical and communications services (I) and conduits at the electrical room (r) began in September 2022.





Building of masonry walls and pouring of concrete slab on grade in October 2022.





Installation of steel columns, beams and second floor metal decking in November 2022






A topping out celebration was held on December 2 to recognize the completion of the steel framing. Building of masonry walls continues.






Where We Are Today






- Structural steel is complete.
- Metal decks have been installed on the second and third floors and part of the roof.
- Second floor slab has been poured.
- Mechanical, electrical and plumbing rough in continues.

Where We Are Today






- Shoring is visible in the apparatus bays to support the second and third floors until the concrete slab has cured.
- Plumbing piping and electrical conduits are visible on the first floor.


What's Ahead in 2023

Installation of historical items, including:










What's Ahead in 2023

- Building close-in (exterior walls, windows, curtainwall, storefront and roofing)
- Continue mechanical, electrical and plumbing rough-in
- Construct interior walls, doors and frames
- Install elevator, finishes, green roof and solar panels
- Fire Department move-in expected early 2024
- Remove and store temporary station and complete site work after Fire Department move-in
