

Bus Bay Expansion at East Falls Church Metrorail Station Design Update

Background

• Transportation staff held a Community Meeting on March 1, 2022 to share the 30% design for the East Falls Church Bus Bay Expansion.





Comments Received on 30% Design

- Comments the County received showed overall support of the project but expressed concerns with:
 - **1. Parking Lot Entrance** Respondents expressed concerns about pedestrian and vehicular traffic interaction at N. Sycamore St parking lot entrance and suggested implementing a raised crosswalk.
 - **2. Bus Loop Entrance** Respondents expressed concerns about the crosswalk distance at N. Sycamore St.
 - **3. Bike Lockers** Respondents questions the need for bike lockers at this location.
 - **4. Washington Blvd** Respondents expressed concerns with vehicular speed at parking lot entrance on Washington Blvd.
 - **5. I-66 Ramp** Respondents expressed concerns with pedestrian and cyclist safety at I-66 ramp right turn onto N. Sycamore St.



 The project team has advanced the design to 60%, and incorporated changes to address comments received during public engagement





1. Parking Lot Entrance – The entrance along N. Sycamore Street remains to accommodate the significant number of parking lot customers traveling southbound. Adding a raised crossing at the entrance would create issues with storm water drainage. The sidewalk at this entrance has been aligned to create a straight path to the station and includes ADA-compliant pedestrian ramps.

2. Bus Loop Entrance – The design update maintains the reduced crossing distance for the entrance to the bus loop from the 30% design concept, which is about 100 feet shorter than the existing crossing. The crosswalk also includes ADA ramps.




3. Bike Lockers – In the 30% design, the number of bike lockers was reduced from what is currently at the station. The updated design changed the location of these lockers, which provides a more open sidewalks for pedestrians near the entrance.





4. Washington Blvd – County transportation staff are evaluating the parking lot entrance at Washington Blvd to determine if a signal is warranted at this location. This will be done separately from this capital project





1. I-66 Ramp – An adjacent county projectis evaluating the alignment and layout of the I-66 ramp to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety at this location. The project team referred all relevant comments to the N Sycamore Street Complete Streets Project.
