Department Overview

- The Circuit Court is the trial court of general jurisdiction and the highest trial court in Arlington County for both civil and criminal cases.
- The Circuit Court has appellate jurisdiction over all cases from the General District Court and the Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court
- The four judges preside over criminal and civil matters, including motions, evidentiary hearings, non-jury trials, jury trials, criminal dispositions, and sentencings.



Department Overview

- The Drug Treatment Court services adult defendants in the Circuit Court. All participants attend weekly substance abuse treatment sessions and are held accountable through intense supervision and monitoring as well as weekly court appearances.
- Reduced incarceration provides direct savings to the County in jail days saved.
