Department Overview

- Only Judicial Officers in Arlington County that operate 365/24/7; we are always on duty
- Comprised of 8.5 state-funded positions with County supplement for some staff
- Issues warrants for the arrest of violators of state law and County ordinances
- Issues Emergency Protective Orders, mental health and medical Emergency Custody Orders, and Temporary Detention Orders
- Admits to bail or commits to jail all persons charged with offenses
- Administers oaths, takes acknowledgements, and acts as conservators for the peace



Magistrate in the COVID-19 Era

- Still on duty; still on-site 365/24/7
 - Schedule modified to limit the number of staff in the office at the same time.
 - Significantly limiting office access
 - Purchased pandemic cleaning equipment (blue lights and air filters) and perform frequent cleanings
- Hybrid approach to holding hearings
 - Tension between pandemic precautions and other law enforcement and defendant needs are starting to improve
 - Hearing room is open on a case-by-case basis office for face-to-face hearings
 - Some hearings are still held through glass
 - Some hearings are held via video
 - Meeting method depends on the circumstances and type of hearing



Focus on Equity

- By being the only judicial officers that operate 365/24/7, the Office ensures that all people have access to the legal system at all times.
- 365/24/7 coverage also ensures a prompt review process of the circumstances of the arrest of defendants and detaining of persons in mental health crisis to determine if and under what circumstances their right to liberty may be returned to them.
- The Office serves a diverse population including stakeholders dealing with mental health and criminal matters in particular.
