# **Department Overview**

## FY 2024 Highlights

#### Ranked Choice Voting (RCV)

Ran Virginia's first election using single-transferable vote, ranked choice voting for County Board.

#### **Risk Limiting Audit**

One of the first three localities in Virginia to conduct a post election audit for a local race using the batchcomparison method.

#### **Polling Place Accessibility Assessments**

Conducted assessments for all 54 polling places to meet state requirements.

#### **Presidential Primary**

Conducted a March Dual Presidential Primary.

- Establish election hotline.
- Increase data transparency.

- Conduct enhanced training for election workers and community organizations.



## Operation

### \$343,200

- Order two card ballots
  & increase volume
- Increase temporary staffing & election officers



# FY 2025 Budget Highlights

## Delivering Safe, Secure, and Accessible Elections

## Safe

- Engage with local, state, and federal partners.
- Offer de-escalation training to staff and election officers.
- Conduct emergency and crisis training exercises.
- Prioritize employee wellness.

### <u>Secure</u>

- Implement enhanced access controls and monitoring for both physical and digital security.
- Provide security training to employees.
- Add Department of Technology Services intern position to assist with completion of Local Election Security Standards.


## Accessible

- New state laws expand access to curbside voting, require signage for curbside voting, and require ADA assessments of all polling places annually.
- Increase the availability of election materials translated into other languages.
- Add ADA and translation features to our website.

- Personnel changes
  - One-time funding for Calendar Year (CY) 2024 Presidential Election \$312,456.
- Non-personnel and revenue changes:
  - One-time funding for Calendar Year (CY) 2024 Presidential Election \$248,744.
  - Partially offset by the removal of one-time FY 2024 funding for Rank Choice Voting Outreach and for the CY 2024 Presidential Primary Election partially reimbursed by the State (\$84,476).



# **Key Budget Considerations**

#### **Polling Place Capacity**


Arlington has the largest precinct in Virginia.

#### Minimum Wage Increase

Hourly rate for election officers is \$12/hr. HB1 Increases minimum wage to \$13.50/hr. in 2025 and \$15/hr. by 2026.

#### **Extension of Post-Election Processes**

- Mail ballot deadline three days after election.
- Same Day Registration requires processing thousands of registrations after election day.
- Canvas deadline extended to ten days.
- Post-Election Audit conducted within twenty days of election.
- Arlington's election will run from September 20<sup>th</sup> to November 27<sup>th</sup> this year.





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
