

Overview: ANP

- ANP (formerly the "Neighborhood Conservation Program") has been in existence for *60 years*.
- ANP staff and ArNAC Representatives have built mutual trust and confidence, valuable assets for Arlington County.
- "Neighborhood Conservation Program Review" Final Report, 2021
- Between 1989 and 2023, ANP constructed **527 community infrastructure projects totaling \$104 million** in Arlington County neighborhoods, which
 - foster pedestrian mobility and safety
 - provide recreational greenspace
 - improve security through street lighting
 - protect natural environments

Overview: Use of CIP funds

- Arlington Neighborhoods Program has a unique CIP project funding process.
- County commitment of CIP bond funds.
- Community proposed CIP projects are vetted and approved by ArNAC for recommendation to the County Board for funding authorization.
- Bonds are issued when construction funds are needed.



Achieving Racial Equity


- Racial Equity considerations are a part of ANP's work on improving Neighborhood Plans and Representation by residents and civic associations in the program.
- This work is being addressed over the next 3-4 years through an Implementation Framework to ensure greater equity in project types and their beneficiaries.
- ArNAC has started incorporating racial equity criteria in project definitions that they consider for recommendation to the County Board for funding. \$1 million in program bond funds have been allocated for this purpose. This work is ongoing.






Program Funding Summary: Total






Map showing distribution of ANP Active and Proposed Projects *



Summary & Conclusion

- The "Neighborhood Conservation Program Review" (NCPR) re-affirmed the importance of CIP investments in Arlington neighborhoods, through the leadership of ANP and ArNAC.
- ArNAC, with ANP's leadership and staff are jointly working to reinvigorate oversight and management of CIP investments, implementing all of the recommendations of the NCPR Report of 2020
- Over the next several years, ANP will procure technical expertise to develop materials and provide training to facilitate participation of underserved residents and communities in this program through ArNAC.
- Civic Associations and their leadership have demonstrated resident and neighborhood commitment to continuing and to expanding successful CIP investments in neighborhood infrastructure through this program.
