### Phase 1 Recap

- October 2022: <u>Analysis of Ownership Housing and Barriers to Homeownership in Arlington County</u>
  - Reports on homeownership trends, mortgage finance trends, barriers to purchasing, housing cost burden of existing owners, and more.
- February 2023: Analysis of Arlington County Homebuyer Programs
  - Looks at performance and history of various Arlington County homeownership programs.
- February March 2023: Roundtables and Focus Groups. <u>Summary</u> <u>Report</u>
  - 5 sessions (condo owners, mortgage lenders, prospective and recent homebuyers, older adults, and real estate brokers)

## Establishing a Vision – Online Feedback Tool

#### June-July, 2023

**Purpose:** Asks residents to weigh in on the role of local government in providing homeownership support.

- 4 Questions. 2 Likert scale questions. 1 ranking/prioritization question. 1 openended.
- **As of** July 6, 2023:
  - 863 unique participants
  - 38% of respondents identified as race or ethnicity other than "White"
  - 45% of respondents 60 years or older, 23% under 40 years old
  - 84% of respondents currently live in Arlington
  - 72% of respondents are existing Arlington homeowners, 23% are renters
  - 12% of respondents are existing condo owners
  - 52% of responses in 22207 (23%), 22204 (16%), and 22201 (13%) zip codes


## **Outreach Efforts for Online Engagement**

#### Popup Events

- 8 popup events throughout June and July (3 events cancelled due to weather).
- 150+ unique participants at popup events.

#### Other Outreach

- Social media + other traditional County outreach methods.
- Direct outreach, partners, stakeholders, and Homeownership Subcommittee members to increase participation.



## **Community Meetings**

- July 11, 2023: Homeownership Subcommittee Meeting
  - Lubber Run Community Center, Hickory and Oak Rooms
  - Subcommittee members will use the feedback derived from the online feedback opportunity to begin establishing a vision statement and goals.
- July 22, 2023: Community Workshop; Establishing Homeownership Objectives
  - Walter Reed Community Center, Gymnasium
  - In-person collaborative workshop to validate the homeownership vision and goals established through earlier engagement and strategize on objectives for accomplishing these vision and goals.

## Phase 3 – Program Recommendations

- August-September, 2023: County staff, in coordination with HR&A, will begin working on program recommendations that respond to community input and Subcommittee ideas.
  - 1. How programs should be targeted to certain underrepresented groups.
  - 2. Return on investment and financial feasibility of proposed program modifications and new programs.
  - 3. Resources needed to implement proposed program modifications and new programs.
  - 4. Funding opportunities to support recommendations.
  - 5. Prioritization of recommendations.
  - Case studies providing examples that demonstrate how the County could implement recommendations.

## Phase 3 – Community Engagement

- September-October, 2023: Once draft program recommendations have been established, County staff will engage stakeholder groups and partners to ensure that there is awareness of the study engagement outcomes and program recommendations..
  - Housing Commission and Homeownership Subcommittee
  - Commission on Aging
  - Disability Advisory Committee
  - NAACP Arlington Branch, Housing Committee
  - Other?
