JFAC Mission: To provide input to the County and School Boards on collaborative long-range facility planning for both the Arlington County Government and Arlington Public Schools, and to include input on capital facilities needs assessment and capital improvement plans (CIPs).

- Emphasize collaborative long-range planning for future County and APS facility needs, based on analysis of the latest trends, forecasts, and service delivery models.
- Review proposed APS and County CIPs prior to their adoption to consider alignment and potential partnership opportunities between County and APS (such as co-location, shared use, adaptive reuse and other efficiencies) to maximize public benefit.
- Review APS and County needs assessment reports, facility capacity and utilization plans, and other reports that inform CIP direction.
- Review periodic updates from County and APS staff on trends and forecasts affecting the community.
- · Partner with staff to facilitate broad community engagement on facilities issues and collaborative long-range planning.
- Complement the work of other Commissions, in particular the PFRC and BLPC, and provide guidance on facility prioritization and any identified challenges.
- All meetings will comply with the Virginia Open Meeting requirements and the Freedom of Information Act and will be publicly advertised.
