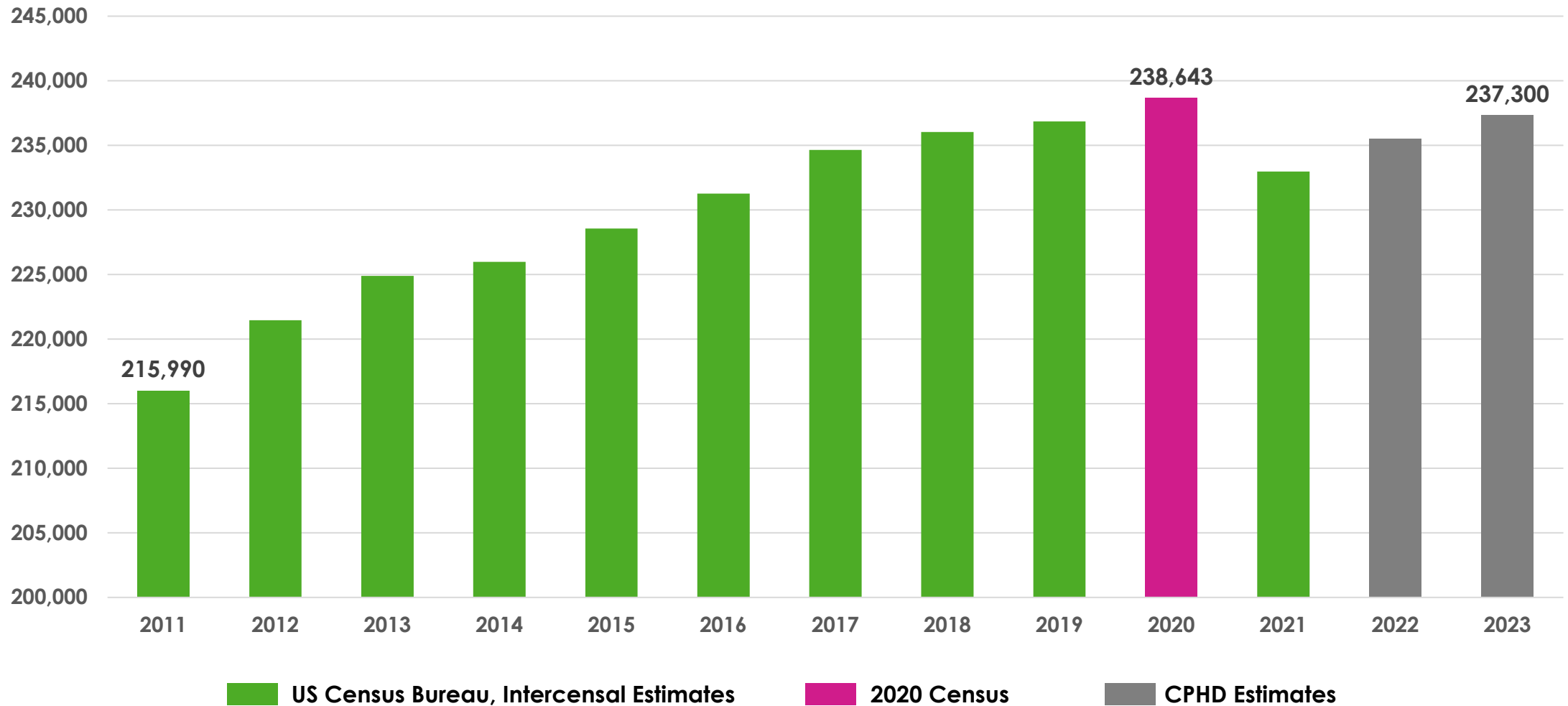

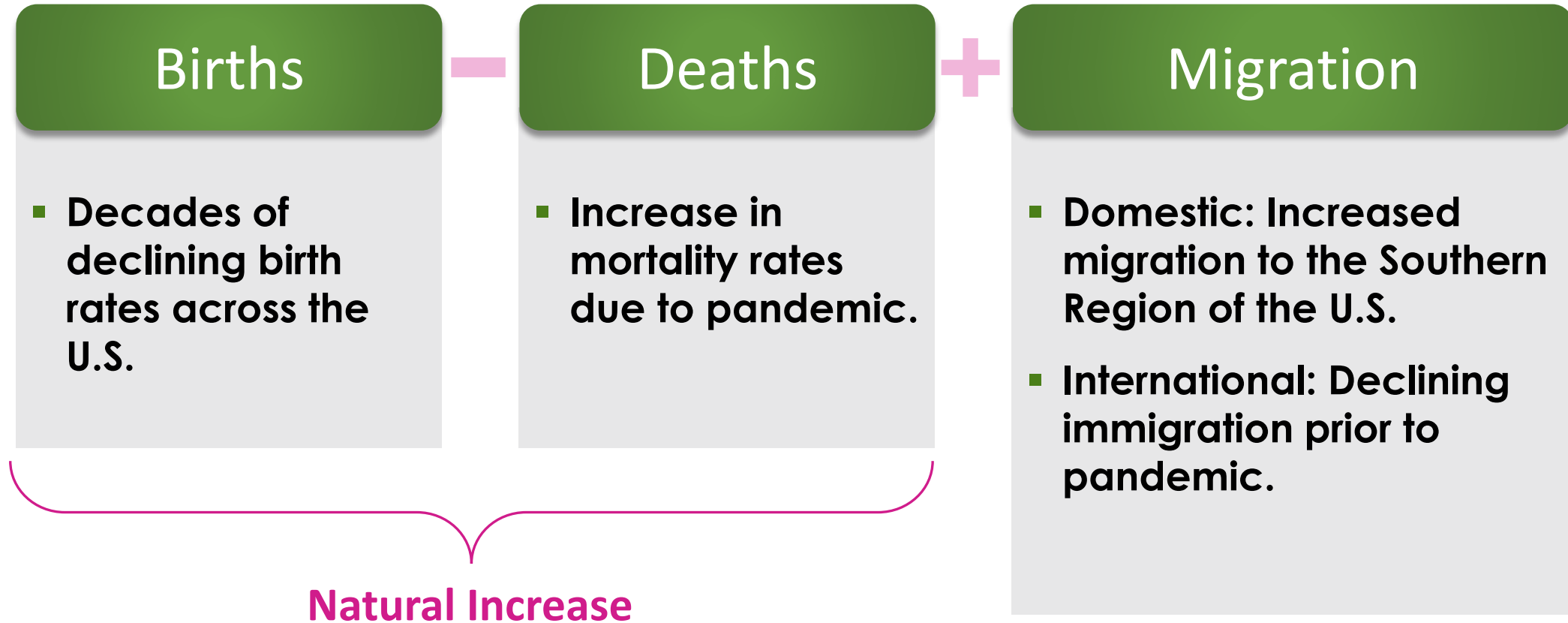

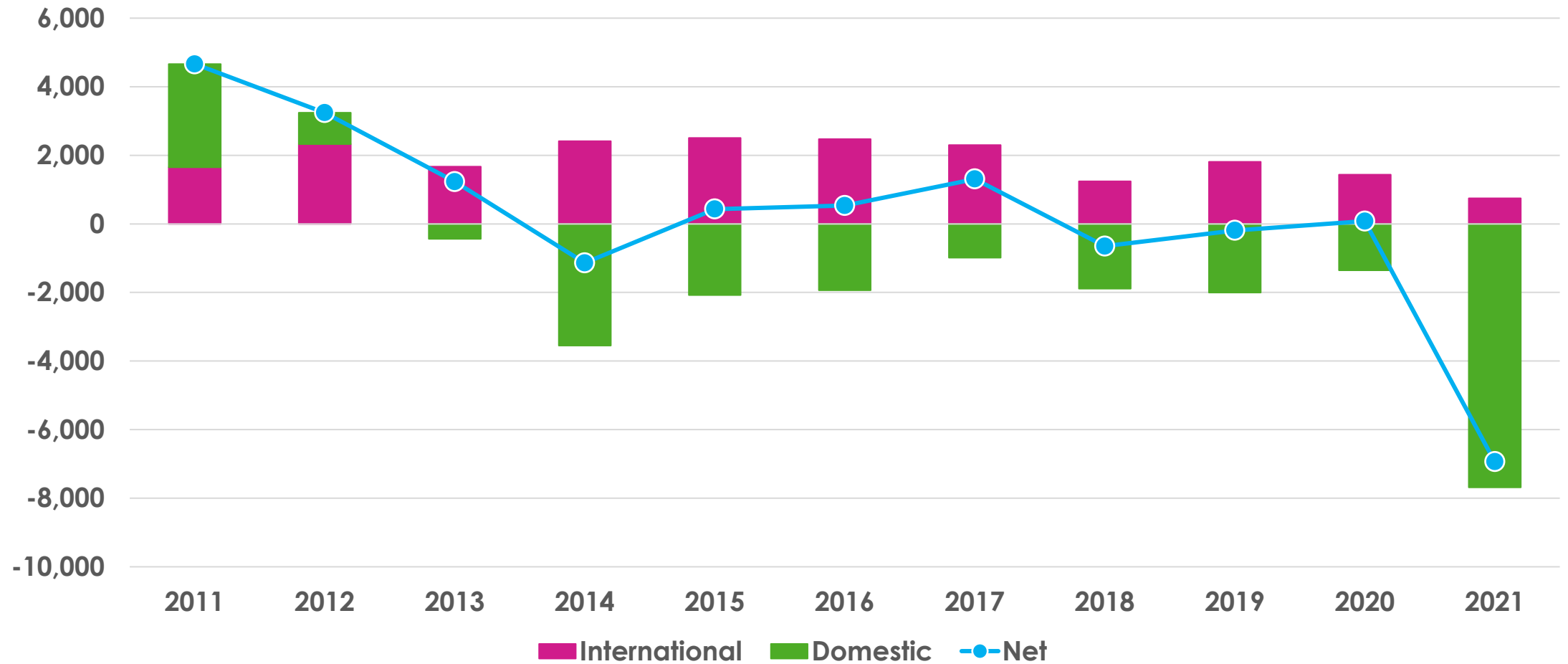
Arlington Population 2011-2023



Components of Change



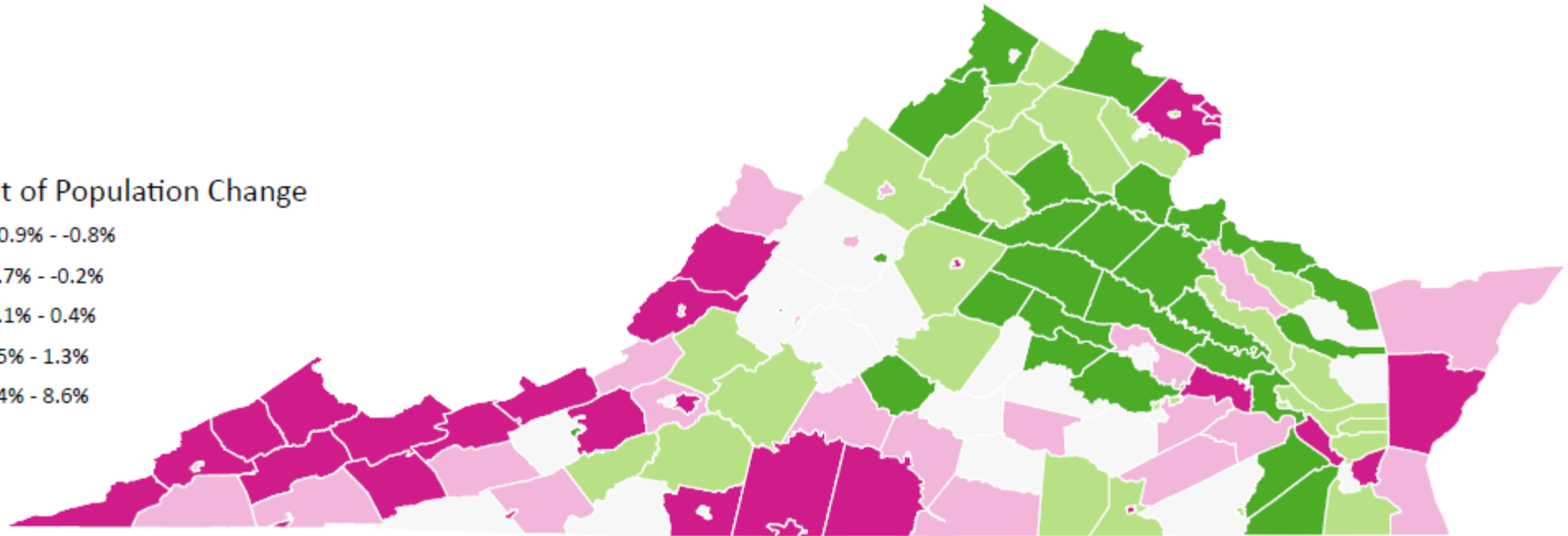
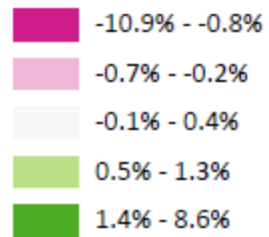
Arlington Migration 2011-2021

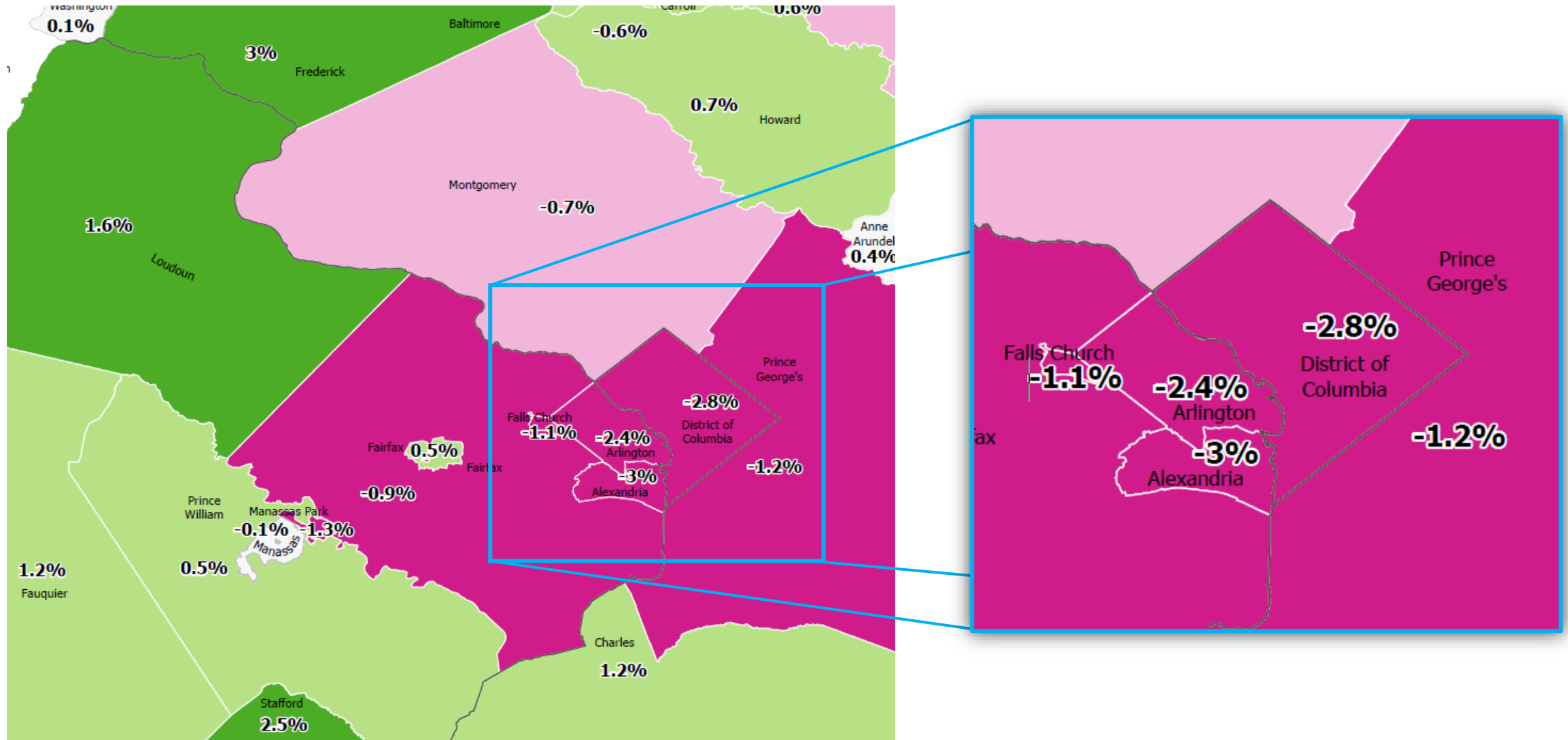
Population Change April 2020 to July 2021

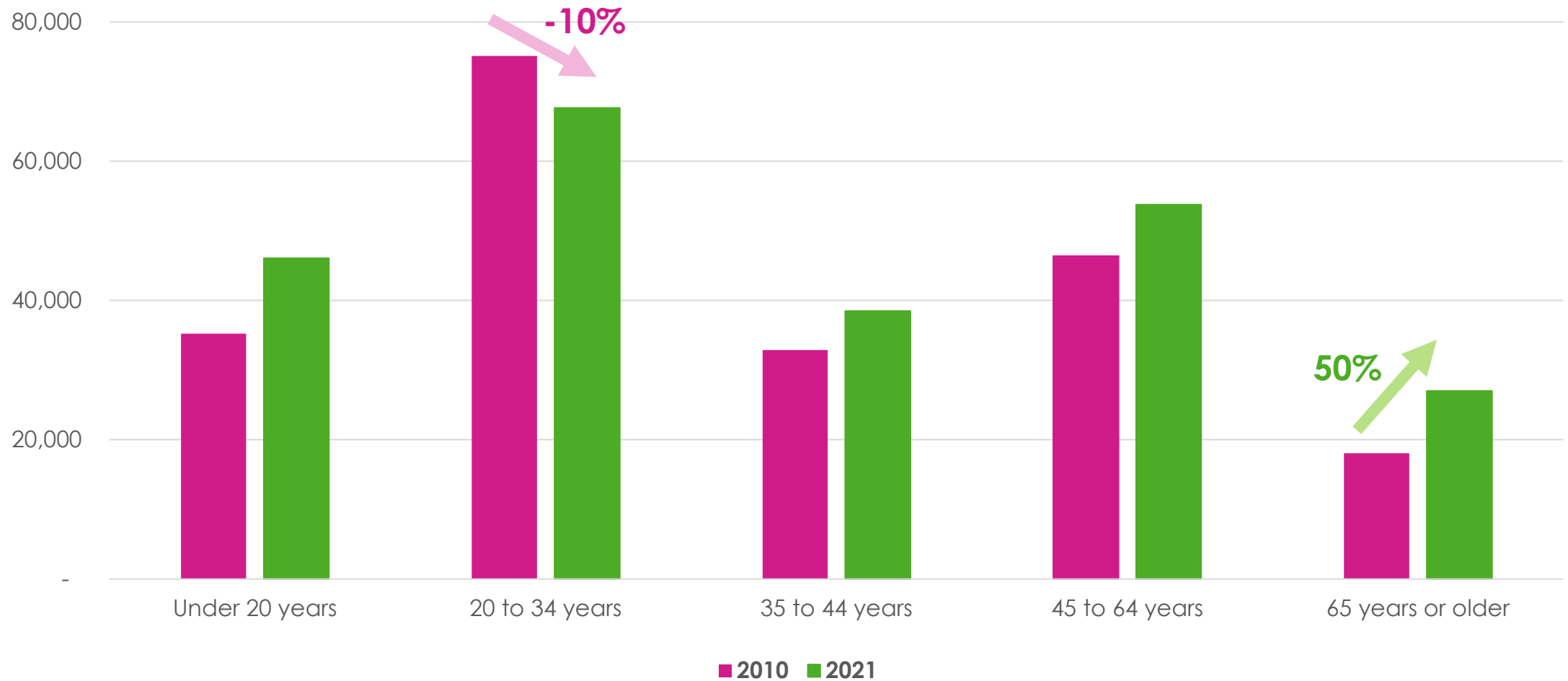
Population Change April 2020 to July 2021



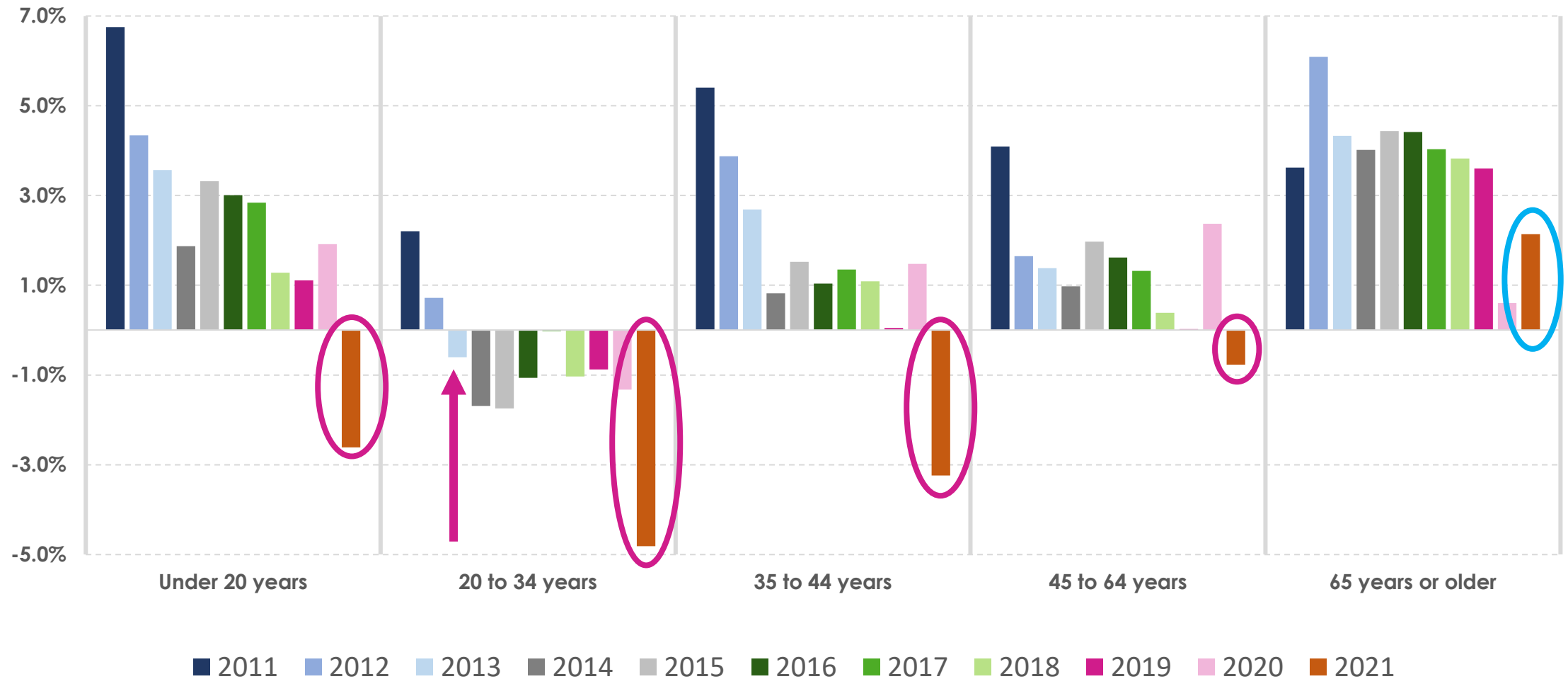

Births Rates

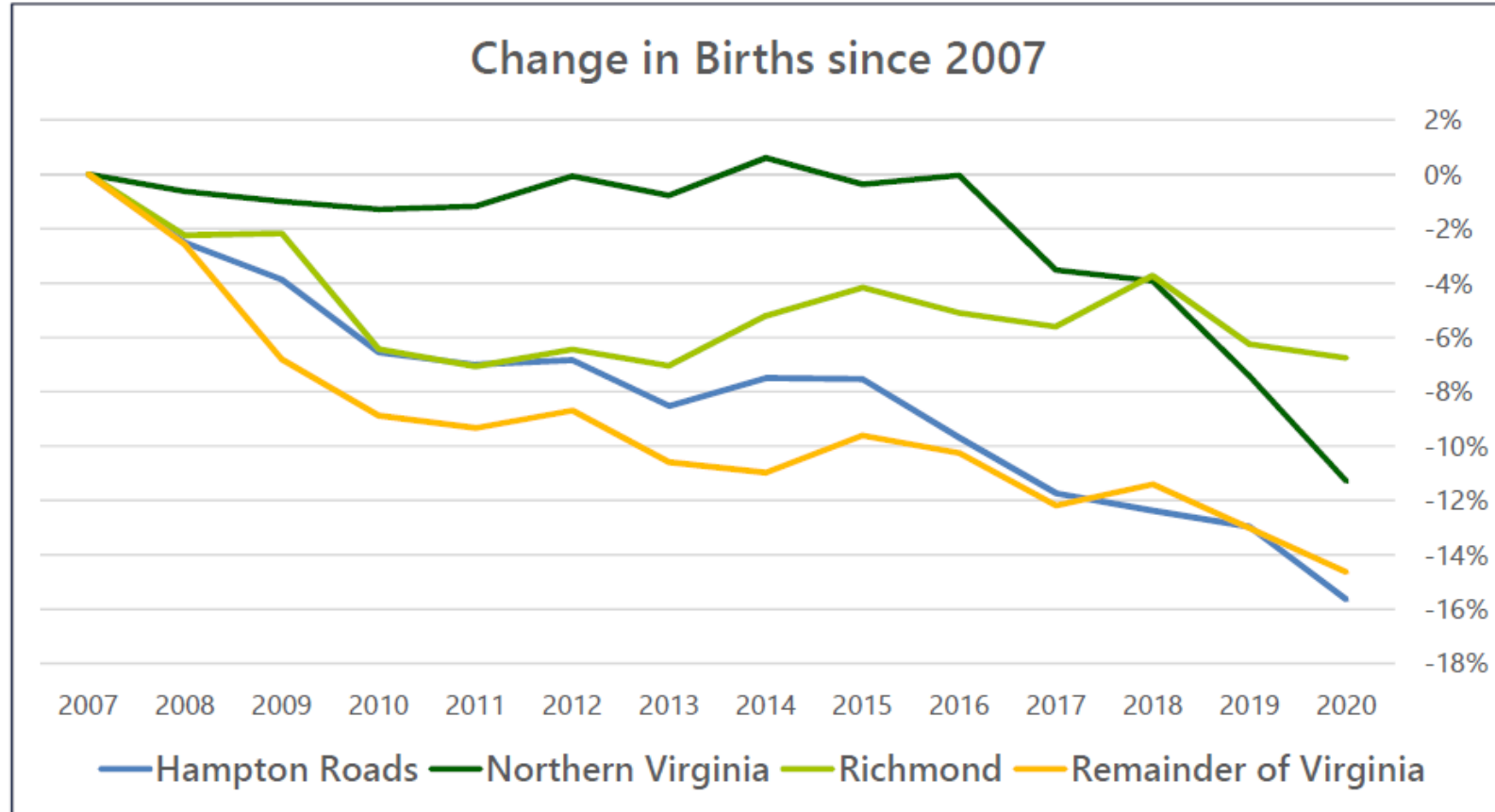
- Between 2007 and 2020, the Total Fertility Rate (TFR) in the United States declined from 2.12 to 1.64.
 - Women are having first child later in life.
 - Women having overall fewer children.
- Since 1990 fertility rates have fallen among all major race/ethnic groups.

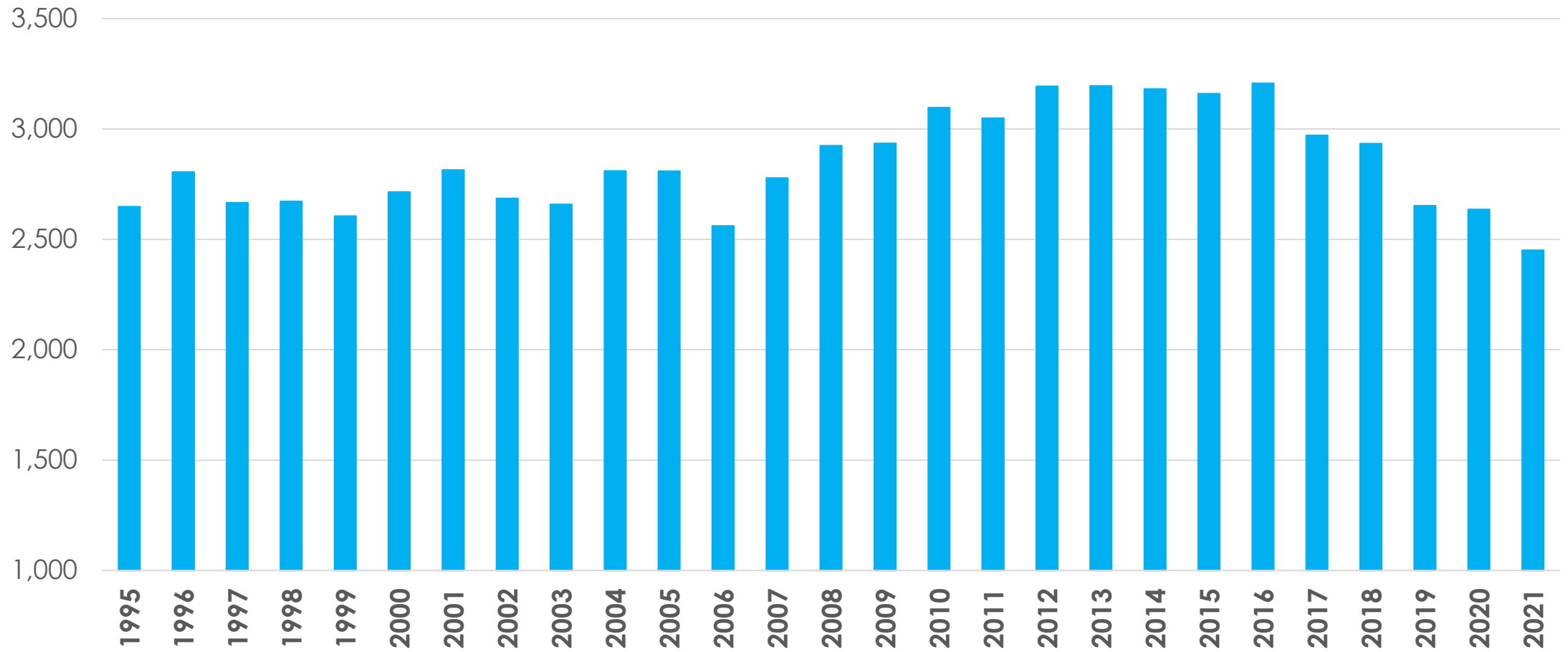

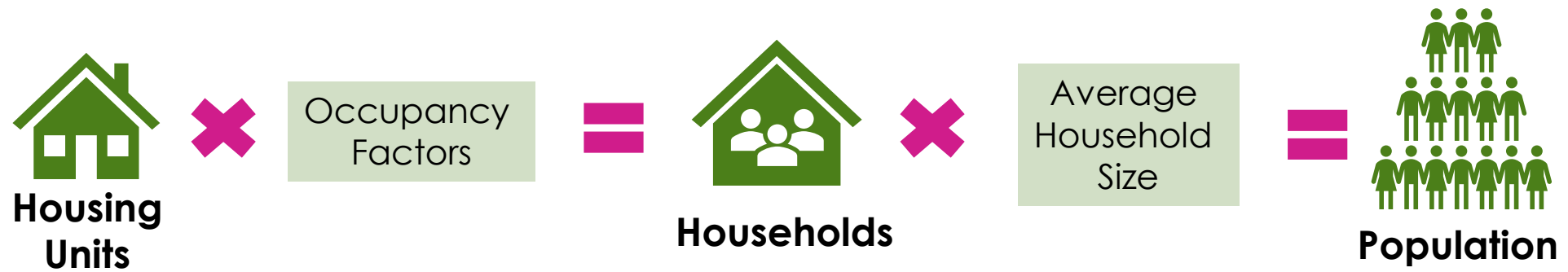
Birth Projections

 - Survival
 - Migration
 - Fertility
- Model is calibrated with Crude Migration Rates and Total Fertility rates to meet two thresholds:
 1. Actual births
 2. Forecast Population

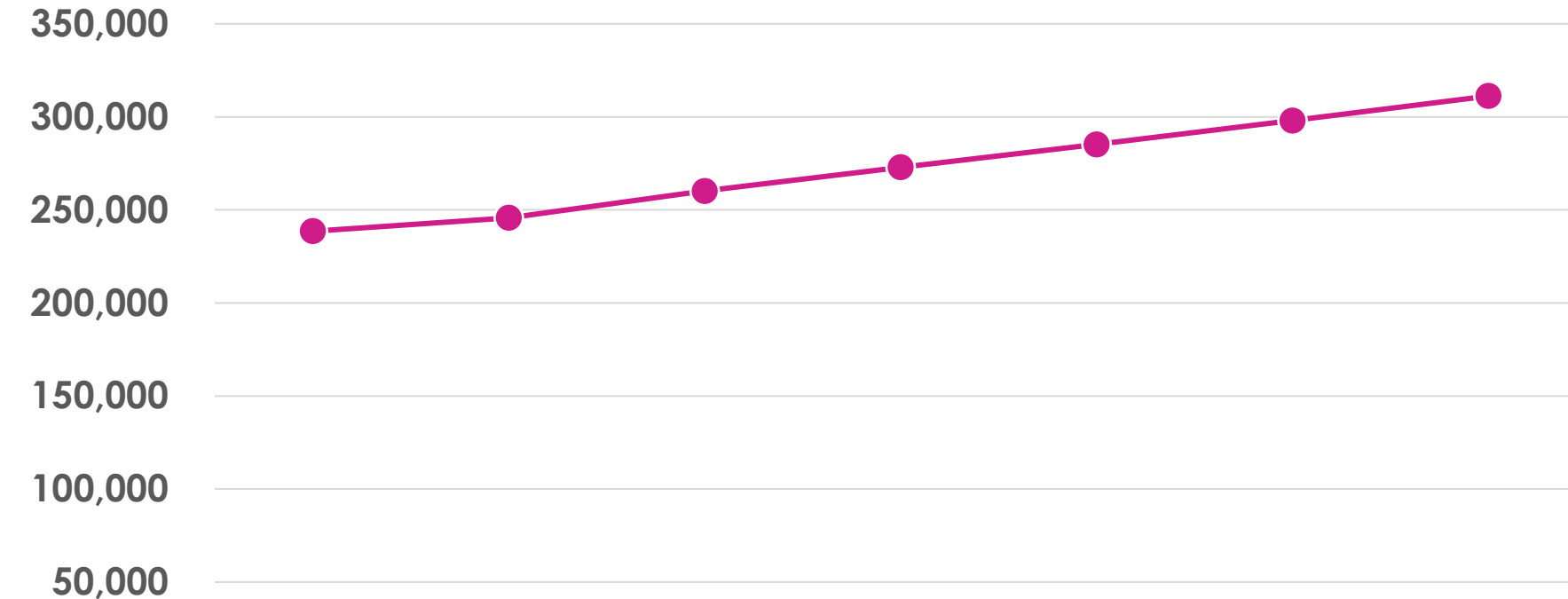

Forecast Round 10.0

- Prepared in Fall 2022 for participation in the **MWCOG regional cooperative forecasting** process.
- Estimates housing units, households, population, and employment in **5-year** increments from **2020-2050**.
- Population is estimated by applying housing **occupancy factors** and **average household size** to the current and forecast housing units.

Development Tracking

- CPHD tracking system in operation since 2000.
- Tracks and analyzes commercial and residential development data based on permits and County Board actions.
- Quarterly and annual reports highlight activity and trends, construction starts, completions, new project approvals and demolitions.

Fourth Quarter 2022

October 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022

This Development Tracking Report, produced by the CPHD Research and Strategic Initiatives Group, provides a summary of county-wide development activity for the Fourth Quarter of 2022 (October 1, 2022 - December 31, 2022) and includes development highlights, summary statistics, and information on active development applications. Detailed data tables based on project status (approved, under construction, completed, and demolished) for this quarter are included as an attachment. As a companion to this report, the Development Tracking Dashboard provides an online interactive experience with the development data for this quarter, trends since 2012, and development within and outside the Planning Corridors. Project photos from staff site visits can be viewed through the Research Team Flickr account. Links to access the dashboard and the Flickr account are at the bottom of this page.

Highlights

- 43,076 SF of retail space for a future grocery store and 553 residential units were approved by the County Board at the Ballston Macy's Site.
- Construction commenced above grade for 178,131 SF of office space, 16,185 SF of retail, and 7,311 SF of other space at 3901 Fairfax Drive as well as two (2) residential units at the Vernon Street Duplex.
- Three residential projects were completed, adding 493 residential units and 12,574 SF of retail to the County. Additionally, the Education Center at Washington-Liberty High School was completed, adding 358,112 SF of classroom space.

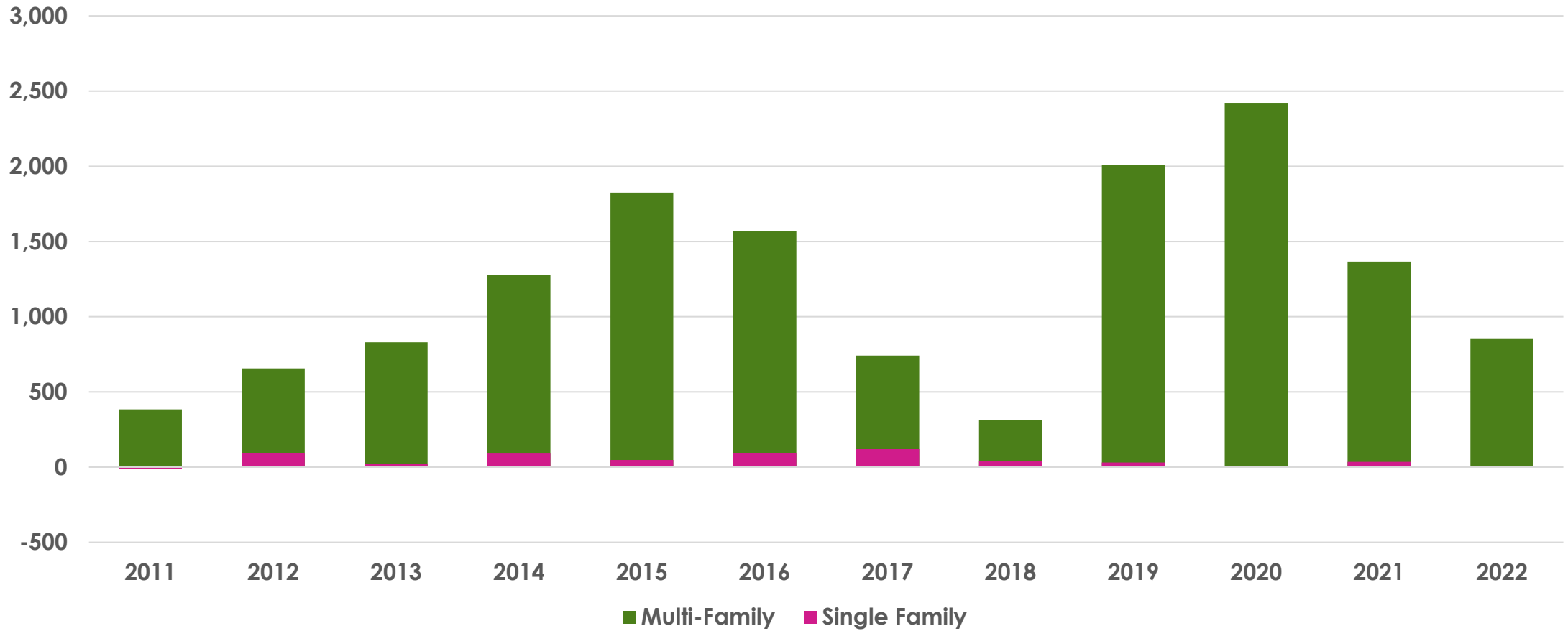

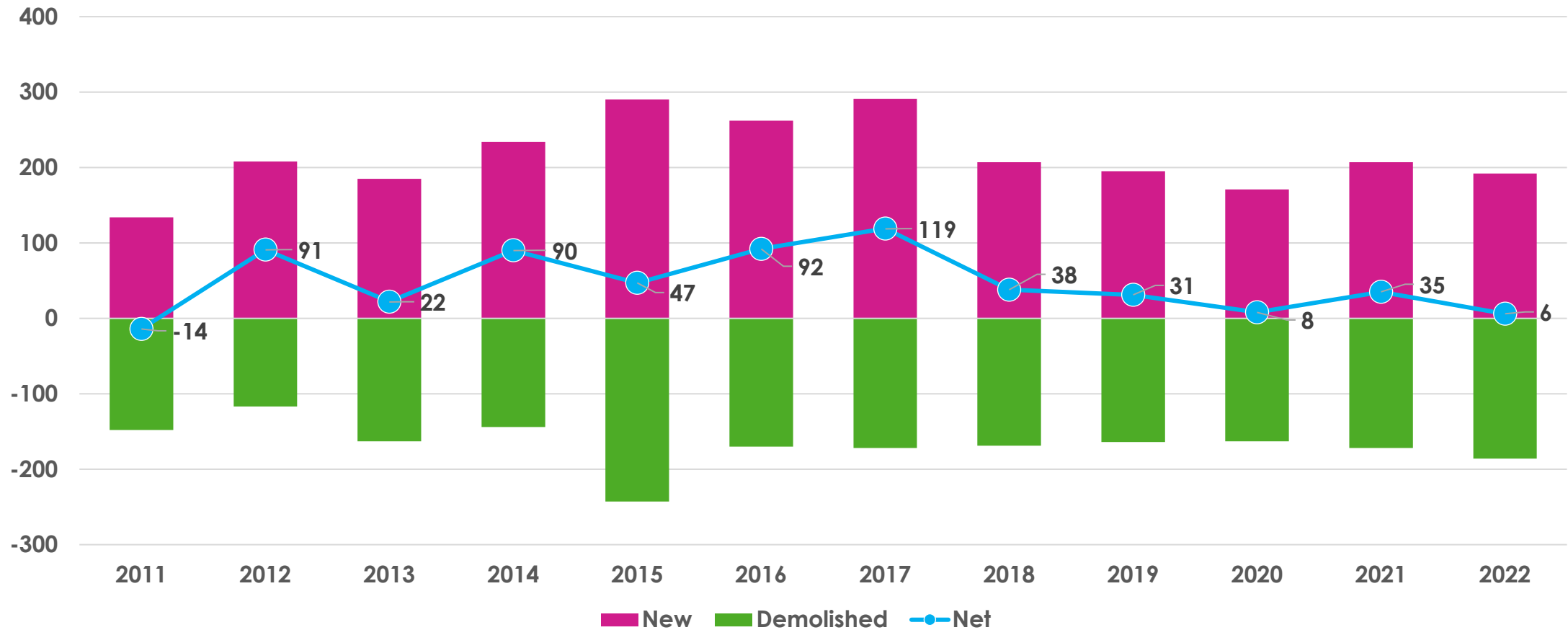
Net New Housing: Single Family and Multi-Family

Housing Stock: Single Family 2011-2022

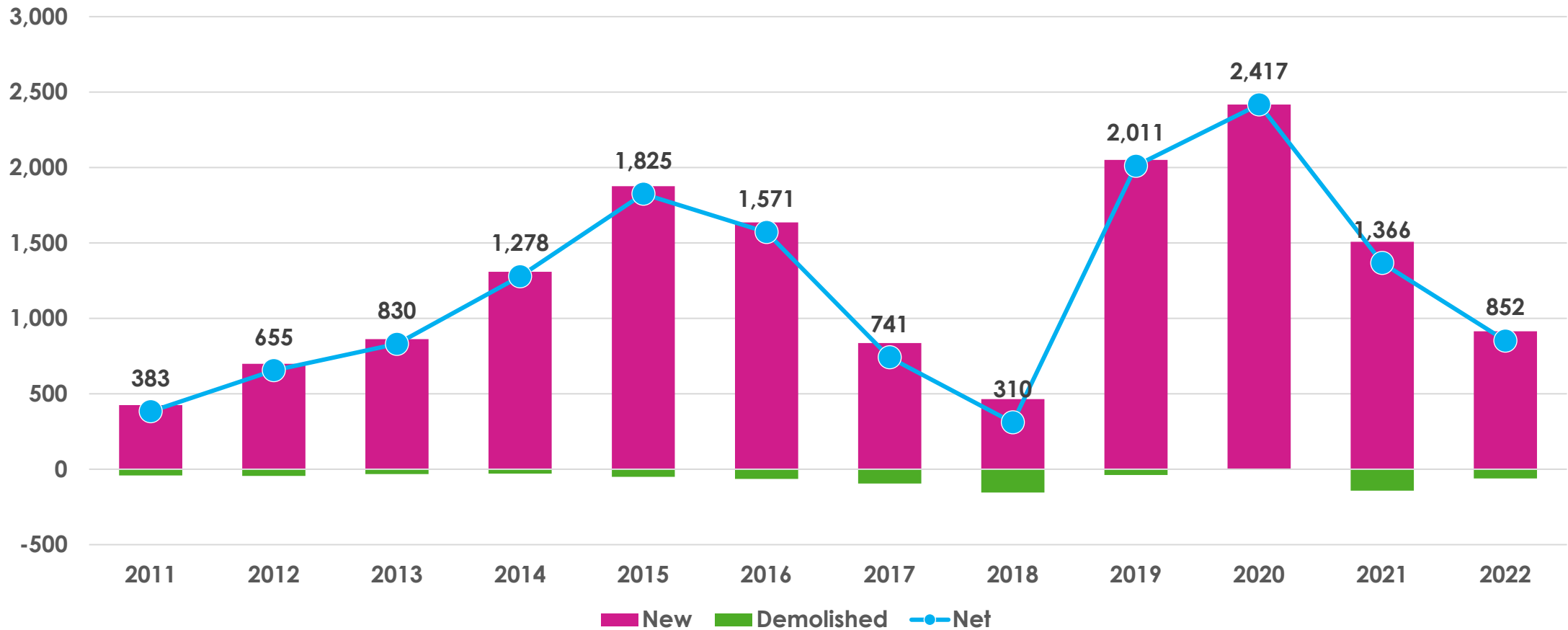
Single Family Detached, Townhomes, Duplexes, Side-by-Side

Key Takeaways

1. Arlington's population age cohort 20-34 years has been declining since 2013.
2. The pandemic impacted natural increase and migration, resulting in Arlington's population decline after the 2020 Census.
3. Arlington's population age 65+ was the age cohort to increase from 2020-2021.
4. The number of births will likely continue to decline for Arlington, Virginia and the nation.
5. CPHD continually monitors the change in housing and demographics and updates population estimates and forecasts to reflect trends.
