11/02/2023	Regarding PSMP Objective 1.4.3: Establish a dedicated pickleball facility to meet the growing demand
	By all metrics this is a complete failure. The number of dedicated pickleball courts in Arlington has actually decreased from 1 to 0.
	When it comes to the "meet demand" aspect: current plans for the Walter Reed project are counterintuitively to reduce the number of courts from 9 to 6 despite a documented overwhelming demand for more courts. DPR is moving in the wrong direction, and is acting counter to the PSMP.
	DPR was slow to act on Objective 1.4.3, giving preferential treatment to tennis. Planning for a tennis facility at Bluemont Park began six months after the PSMP was passed, whereas planning for a pickleball facility was delayed for three years.
	PSMP Objective 1.4.3 has become a national embarrassment for Arlington, making the front page of the New York Times, and Late Night with Stephen Colbert.
	DPR's "measured approach" to pickleball and to this PSMP Objective have been a disaster. Tennis has over 50 dedicated courts. At the very least, it's time to plan a dedicated pickleball facility with twelve pickleball courts. Once the next Statistically Valid Survey comes out, there will be a number reflecting demand in Arlington. Objective 1.4.3 is a mandate to meet that demand.
