WHEREAS, George Mason University operates three campuses in the Commonwealth of Virginia—including the Arlington Campus established in 1979; and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 1972, a contingent from George Mason College met with Governor A. Linwood Holton in Richmond to sign House Bill 210 which established George Mason University as a free-standing four-year public institution of higher education; and

WHEREAS, Rector John "Til" Hazel Jr. helped acquire Mason's School of Law located in Arlington in 1979; and

WHEREAS, George Mason University achieved level-three management autonomy in 2021, which is the highest level of management flexibility granted to public institutions of higher education in Virginia; and

WHEREAS, George Mason University is the most diverse, fastest growing, and largest public four-year institution in the Commonwealth, serving 39,134 students, of which 24 percent of undergraduate students are first-generation college students, and 1 in 12 are affiliated with the military, with 10,895 staff and faculty, and more than 215,900 alumni, including 135,300 currently in the Commonwealth; and
