



# Arlington Community Emergency Response Team

Created in the wake of 9/11 in 2002 by concerned residents, Arlington CERT volunteers work with the Arlington County government in building a more resilient community through preparedness and response activities.

# Who We Are

Arlington Community Emergency Response Team (Arlington CERT) is a diverse, trained volunteer group composed of 300+ Arlington community members. More than 1,200 community members have gone through the training to become volunteers and have contributed more than 24,000 hours.



## **Volunteer Training**

Volunteers must complete our 30-hour CERT Basic Training (CBT), a national curriculum developed by FEMA.

CBT covers emergency preparedness and basic disaster response skills, including fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

Interactive, in-person classes are taught by local public safety personnel and volunteers twice a year.



## **Verification + Credentialing**

All volunteers have passed national and state sex offender checks. Upon completion of their training, volunteers receive a CERT ID, t-shirt, backpack, and safety vest.



## **Organization**

Arlington CERT is sponsored by the Department of Public Safety Communications and Emergency Management (DPSCEM) and collaboratively managed by DPSCEM staff and Arlington CERT volunteers. Volunteers are organized into 9 neighborhood teams which are led by volunteer leaders.

# **Our Impact**

#### **Community Outreach**

- Teaches hands-on lifesaving skills workshops (Until Help Arrives)
- Delivers emergency preparedness presentations (First 15)
- Engages with the public at local events and fairs (e.g., Arlington County Fair)

#### **Emergency Response**

- Provides critical support during local emergencies (e.g., COVID, 2019 flooding)
- Provides standby support for reoccurring large events requiring large public safety presence (e.g., July 4th, elections)
- Enhances first responder training (e.g., survivor acting, admin support, moulage)

#### **Continuing Education**

- Refines volunteer emergency response skills through repeated training and drills
- Promotes volunteer continuing education through resource sharing and engagement opportunities
