Public comment period: September 3-18, 2024



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- The Community Development Fund program funded 44 programs using a combination of CDBG, CSBG, TANF and local AHIF Housing Services funds.
- Donated volunteer hours for programs supported by the Community Development were valued at approximately \$775,000.
- Subrecipients leveraged more than \$ 12.5 million from sources other than CDBG, CSBG, TANF and HOME funds for grant programs.

WHAT'S NEXT IN FY2025?

- Newly funded Arlington County Clothesline for Kids will offer clothing and coats to low-income families, free of charge in a welcoming store environment.
- APAH will expand its resident services program at Ballston Station, offering services and programming to low- and moderate-income households at the committed affordable housing property.
- The ENDependence Center of Northern Virginia (ECNV) will provide community resources and referrals to local housing assistance programs.
- CARE, Inc. will provide an afterschool program developed on the 4-H model to provide skills and practical learning experiences for Green Valley youth.
- Arlington Thrive Community Navigator will work directly with Arlington residents and nonprofit partners to provide access to a variety of Arlington social services.
- Friends of Guest House will help justice-involved returning females find and enroll in training/workforce development, seek educational attainment and benefits enrollment and general supportive services to enable them to successfully re-enter the community.
