

The Ballston Metro Station Area (MSA) is situated on the Orange Metrorial line at the western end of the Rosslyn-Ballston Corridor. The Ballston MSA is also known as Arlington's hub of science and technology with a high concentration of scientific research agencies. Ballston is one of Arlington's oldest communities and has been a major retail center since the 1950s. Development guidelines adopted for Ballston in 1980 sought for a mix of retail, office, and residential units. Today, Ballston is a mix if high density office and residential development, surrounded by single family attached and detached homes in the northern and south western portions of the MSA.

The Virginia Square Metro Station Area (MSA) is situated on the Orange Metrorail line between the Clarendon and Ballston Stations. In the mid-1900s, Virginia Square served as an important commercial district for the County. More recently, Virginia Square has become the cultural and educational center within the Rosslyn-Ballston Corridor, with developments such as the Virginia Square campus of George Mason University, Arlington Central Library, and the Arlington Arts Center. Within the last 10 years, there has been significant residential development in Virginia Square, adding over 2,200 housing units since 2000.

The 2010 Census shows the demographics of Virginia Square to be similar to its neighboring Metro Station areas. The residents of Virginia Square are young, apartment dwellers, with the majority living in one and two person households.







The Rosslyn Metro Station Area (MSA) is the eastern anchor of the Rosslyn-Ballston (R-B) corridor and is situated across the Potomac River from Washington, D.C. In 1962, the Arlington County Board adopted the Rosslyn Plan which encouraged high density office, commercial, and residential development. In 1992 the Arlington County Board adopted the Rosslyn Station Area Plan Addendum with the goal to make Rosslyn a more functional, urban, and livable place. Today, the Rosslyn MSA is a mix of high-rise office and multi-family dwellings, townhomes and very few single family detached housing units.

The 2010 Census data shows Rosslyn to be similar to the other MSAs in the R-B Corridor. The residents of the Rosslyn MSA are young and live in one and two person households. The Rosslyn MSA has the highest share of Asian residents living in the R-B Corridor.



The Pentagon MSA is part of the Jefferson Davis (JD) Corridor, located to the west of JD highway. The MSA contains a mix of residential, office, and commercial uses, including the Pentagon City Fashion Centre, the Ritz-Carlton hotel, and Pentagon Row. In addition the Pentagon City MSA includes a mix of multi-family apartment and condominium buildings and office developments.

According to the 2010 Census, over 91 percent of households in the Pentagon MSA are one or two person households and 77 percent of all households are nonfamily households.



The Crystal City Metro Station Area (MSA) is situated on the Yellow and Blue Metrorail lines between Pentagon City and Reagan National Airport Metro stations. Part of the Jefferson Davis (JD) Corridor, The Crystal City MSA includes land on either side of JD Highway, from I-395 in the north to the City of Alexandria. While office towers are most prominent along Crystal City's skyline, there is substantial residential development in the MSA.

According to the 2010 Census, over 73 percent of housing units are rental units. The majority of households are one or two person households at almost 89 percent of all households. Similar to the MSAs in the R-B corridor, the largest share of residents in the Crystal City MSA are in the age group 25-34.



The Columbia Pike Major Planning Area refers to the land located on the north and south sides of Columbia Pike from the western boundary of Fairfax County to the eastern boundary of I-395 and South Joyce Street. Development along the Pike began in the early 1900s. Overtime, the corridor has become an assortment of auto-oriented office and residential development. The Columbia Pike Initiative was adopted by the Arlington County Board in 2002, with the goal of a walkable, mixed-use community. Today it is a mix of single family detached homes, townhomes, garden and high-rise apartment and condominium high-rises, and commercial and office buildings.
