1. Public Comment

a. Public encouraged Arlington staff to work with STAR and providers to increase service levels.

b. Public comment asked for STAR Accessibility Subcommittee meeting announcement to be sent several days in advance of meeting.

2. Approval of the Meeting Notes

a. The meeting notes were approved.

3. Performance Metrics

- a. Staff reviewed the STAR Metrics report showing on time performance, ridership, and other metrics.
- b. Subcommittee members asked about trips missed by provider. Staff stated service providers have a working plan of action to increase staffing levels.
- c. The subcommittee shared that focus should be placed on people who missed a trip back home, and not leaving people stranded should have a higher level of importance when assigning rides over other trips. Staff stated it will be evaluated.

4. Metrics Dashboard

- a. Staff shared the prototype for the STAR metrics dashboard.
- b. Staff asked the subcommittee members to choose less than ten of the metrics to be displayed on STAR metrics dashboard.
- c. Subcommittee members will be given time to decide which metrics get displayed.

5. STAR Public Engagement

- a. Staff went over Arlington County's public values regarding public engagement. Staff announced that a round of public engagement will be held to allow the public to help decide the future of STAR and STAR policies.
- b. Staff expressed that the proposed STAR policy changes have been fully eliminated.
- c. The subcommittee expressed their approval of the elimination of the proposed STAR policy changes.
- d. The subcommittee asked about the ability to amend "will call" policies, staff stated these policies will be addressed with the public engagement process.
