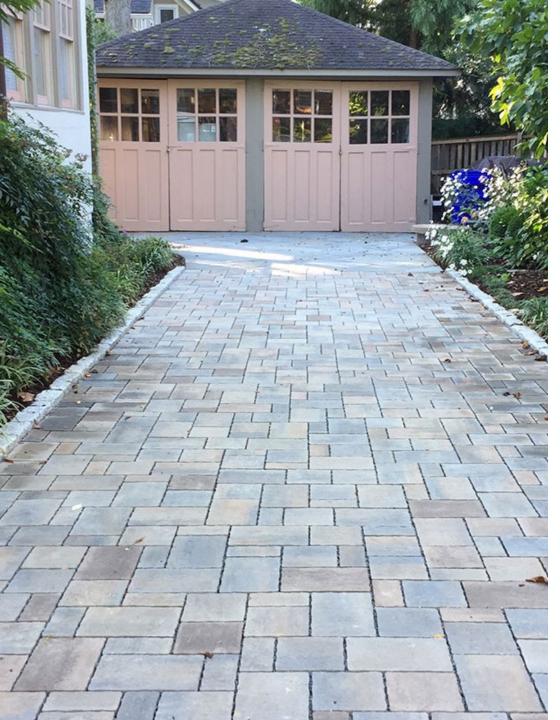

Review Current Utility Recommendations

Fee Structure Recommendations for Property Types



Rate Structure for Single-Family Residential (SFR)

- Attached (townhomes & duplexes)
 - Properties charged 0.60 ERU
- Detached below:

Tier	Impervious Area Range	Billed
Tier 1	≤ 1600 SF	0.60 ERU
Tier 2	> 1600 - ≤ 3600 SF	1.00 ERU
Tier 3	> 3600 - ≤ 4800 SF	1.70 ERU
Сар	> 4800 SF	Per ERU, like Non-Res (NR)



Rate Structure for Multi-Family (MFR)

- Charged based on number of units per property
 - Properties charged
 0.18 ERU/ unit



Rate Structure for Non-Residential (NR)

 Charged based on impervious area (IA) of each property, per ERU

Credit Program Overview

- The primary purpose of the utility is to recover costs for the stormwater management program
- Per VA code, a credit program is required
- Intent is to balance benefits of the credit program with the administrative cost and burden
 - Considerations of equity





Credits will be Available for Mandatory and Voluntary Activities

- The credit program will include both mandatory and voluntary actions
- Up to 35% for all customers
 - Approximately \$80/ERU
- VA law requires that localities provide a credit for qualifying stormwater facilities, even mandatory ones installed as part of a development project



Mandatory Stormwater Facility Credit – All Property Types

- Installed before 2014, or Streamlined permit (LDA) = 5%
- Installed after 2014:
 - Less than 1 acre = 10%
 - Over 1 acre = 15%
 - -LDA 2.0 = 15%
- The performance and design standard for mandatory stormwater facilities have increased over time
- Property owner must complete required compliance inspection and submit forms on time for automatic annual credit

Voluntary Actions - 5% each

Voluntary Actions - 10% each

- Rain Garden
- Permeable Driveway

MAX Credit of 35%

Multi-Family and Non-Residential

Mandatory Structural Stormwater Facilities (LDA)

Up to **15%**

Voluntary Actions - 5% each

- Conservation Landscaping
- Tree Planting
- Stormwater Education Event
- Storm Drain Marking

Voluntary Actions - 10% each

- Rain Garden
- Permeable Parking Lot / Driveway
- Adopt A Street
- Stream Clean-up
- Invasive Plant Cleanup
- Parking Lot / Private Street
 Sweeping

MAX Credit of 35%

Example of New Stormwater Utility Fee for Church

+3 additional properties = Estimated Annual Fee \$20,501 - \$22,175

Less 35% Max Credits for Voluntary Actions:

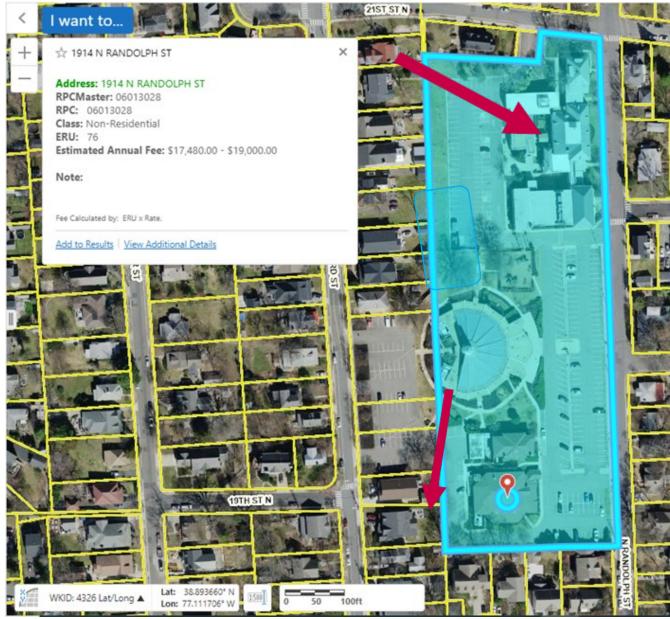
10% = Invasive Plant Removal (30 volunteer hours)

10% = Parking Lot Sweeping (6 times)

10% = Rain Garden

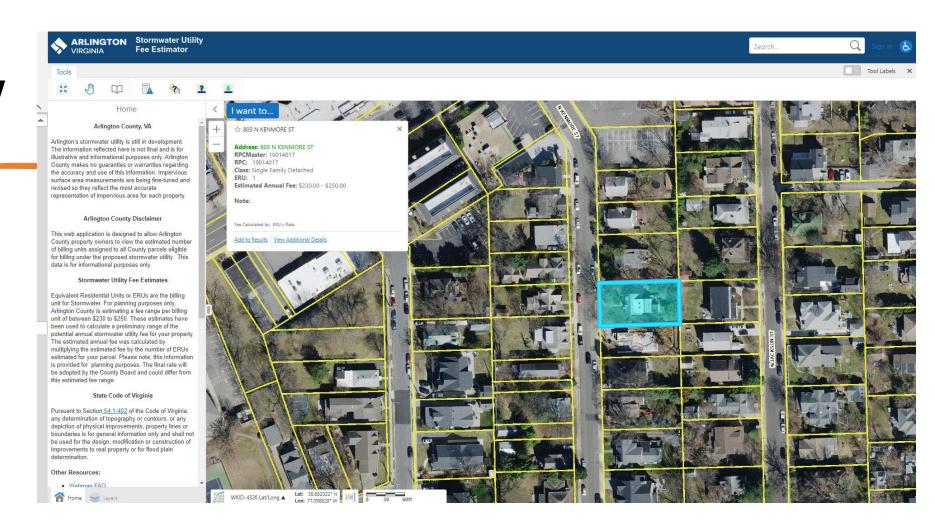
5% = Tree Planting

<u>Total Utility Fee = \$13,326 - \$14,414</u>



Webmap Overview

- The webmap bill estimator is online
- It allows property owners to look up the estimated ERUs for their property and estimated stormwater utility fee



Focused outreach for tax exempt property owners

- Faith groups feedback
 - Concern about how this new expense will affect their ability to offer other social service programs
 - Request to delay or phase implementation to allow for budget planning
 - Expressed interest in the credit program and felt that their organizations would take advantage of the program
 - Requested that property owners with multiple parcels be considered as a unit for voluntary credits to apply to
- Additional information session for non-profits/cemeteries scheduled Nov 2

Other ongoing implementation items

- Develop bill dispute process
- Develop credit manual, documentation information, and application form
- Finish digitizing parcel information
- Finish development of Stormwater Account Management System (SAMS)
- Integration of stormwater utility fee with Real Estate tax bill
- Communication of program elements to property owners

Next Steps

- Work session with County Board December 2022
- Continued outreach to community Winter 2022-23
- Advertise Utility & Fee February 2023
- Budget Hearing early April 2023
- Utility & Fee Adoption mid/ late April 2023
- 1st Bill (if approved) May 2023 (due date June 15, 2023)

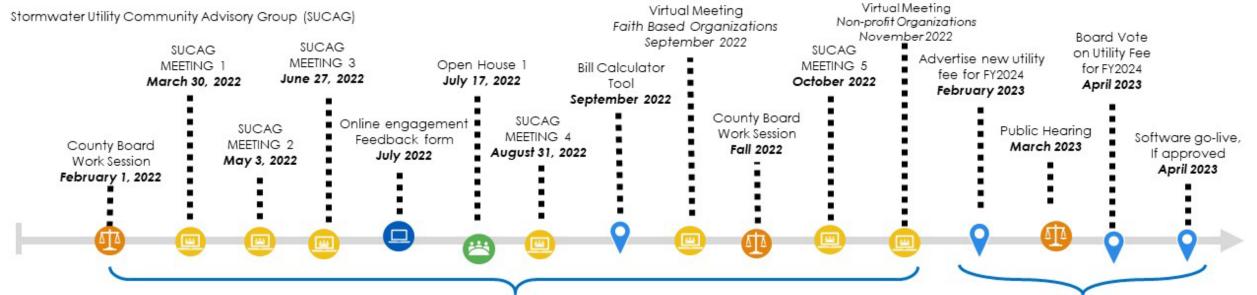
