

















Neighborhoods





What entry point do you currently use to access the site? (select all that apply)




What mode of transportation do you use to get to the Kenmore fields? (select all that apply)






How do you or your family members currently use Kenmore fields? (select all that apply)






Once the Kenmore fields are converted to synthetic turf, what sports do you envision being played at the site? (select all that apply)

Theme	Support for the Project	Concerns about Synthetic Turf	Confusion about "Dirt" on the Rectangular Field
Summary	 Many commenters shared their support for the Kenmore Field Conversion Project. Comments cited synthetic turf as a solution for cancellations or postponements, additional field opportunities for practices and games, and reduced maintenance costs as reasons for support. 	 Many respondents expressed concerns over the conversion from natural grass to turf. Most concerns were about potential health impacts focused on athlete safety, sustainable materials, and playing surface temperature during warmer months. A few comments noted the messiness of turf as a negative impact. 	 Several responses asked why a dirt infield for the baseball field would be included in the middle of the rectangular fields. These commenters felt like the dirt infield would lead to cancellations in rainy conditions or create safety issues for athletes.




