

What do we know about population change in Arlington?


- What age group has grown the fastest in Arlington since 2000?
 - 65-74 year olds: +50%
 - 55-64 year olds: +49%

- What jurisdiction has the highest share of 25-34 year olds? 65+ year olds?
 - Arlington: 28%


Percent Change by Age Group, Arlington, 2000 to 2012


 Has the non-white (non-Hispanic) population increased or decreased in Arlington?

 In what jurisdiction has the non-white (non-Hispanic) population increased the fastest?


What do we know about population change in Arlington?

- Has the non-white (non-Hispanic) population increased or decreased in Arlington?
 - Increased by 8% between 2000 and 2012
 - Decreased as a share of population; grew more slowly than the white (non-Hispanic) population
- In what jurisdiction has the non-white (non-Hispanic) population increased the fastest?
 - Fairfax: +51%


Percent Change by Race/Ethnicity, Arlington, 2000 to 2012



Share of Population by Race/Ethnicity, Arlington, 2000




Share of Population by Race/Ethnicity, Arlington, 2012




Share of Population that is Not White (Non-Hispanic)

What do we know about income change in Arlington?

- What share of Arlington households have incomes less than \$15,000? Less than 30% AMI?
 - Is that share higher or lower than in other jurisdictions?

 Has the number of households with incomes less than \$60,000 increased or decreased since 2000? What about the number of households with incomes of \$200,000 or more?


What do we know about income change in Arlington?

- What share of Arlington households have incomes less than \$15,000? Less than 30% AMI?
 - 5% of households have income of less than \$15,000 = 4,500 households
 - 10% of households have incomes lower than 30% AMI = 9,600 households
- Is that share higher or lower than in other jurisdictions?
 - Lower than D.C. but similar to that of Montgomery, Alexandria and Fairfax


What do we know about income change in Arlington?

- Has the number of households with incomes less than \$60,000 increased or decreased since 2000?
 - Decreased by 10%
- What about the number of households with incomes of \$200,000 or more?
 - Increased by 60%


Share of Households by Household Income (2012 \$s), Arlington, 2012



Share of Households by Income as a Pct of Area Median Income, Arlington, 2010-2012




Share Households Earning Less than 30% AMI, 2010-2012

What do we know about housing costs in Arlington?


- What share of households spend more than 30% of income on housing costs?
 - How has that share changed since 2000?
 - How does that share compare with other jurisdictions?

What do we know about housing costs in Arlington?

- What share of households spend more than 30% of income on housing costs?
 - 39% of renter households = 20,700 households
 - 24% of owner households = 9,600 households
- How has that share changed since 2000?
 - This share has increased for both renters and owners.
- How does that share compare with other jurisdictions?
 - Renter households are less housing cost burdened in Arlington as compared to neighboring jurisdictions
 - Owner households are less housing cost burdened than D.C. and Montgomery, but more burdened than Fairfax and Alexandria.


Share of Renter HHs by Pct of Income Spent on Rent, Arlington County

County = 2000 = 2012




Share of Renter Households Spending over 30% on Rent

Share of Owner HHs by Pct of Income Spent on Select Owner Costs, Arlington County



What does cost burden data tell us about housing needs in Arlington? What else do we want to know?

What do we know about who faces the highest cost burdens in

- Arlington?
 What age group* is most likely to spend 30% or more on housing?
- Hispanic households* are more likely than white households to be cost burdened—how much more?
- What share of persons with disabilities* spend more than half of their income on rent?
- What share of households below 30% AMI spend more than half their income on rent?

What do we know about who faces the highest cost burdens in

- Arlington?
 What age group is most likely to spend 30% or more on housing?
 - 65% of renters over 65 years old = 2,400 households
 - 29% of owners under 34 years old = 1,800 households
 - For both renters and owners combined,
 - 38% of those under 34 spend more than 30% of their income on housing costs = 12,500 households
 - 37% of those over 65 spend more than 30% of their income on housing costs = 4,500 households


What do we know about who faces the highest cost burdens in Arlington?

- Hispanic households are more likely than white households to be cost burdened how much more?
 - 57% of Hispanic renters are = 3,900 households
 - vs 38% of non-Hispanic renters
 - 48% of Hispanic owners are = 1,400 households
 - vs 21% of non-Hispanic renters


What do we know about who faces the highest cost burdens in Arlington?

- What share of persons with disabilities spend more than half of their income on rent?
 - 58% of disabled renters = 1,800 households
 - 17% of disabled owners = 400 households
- What share of households below 30% AMI spend more than half their income on rent?
 - -84% of renters = 6,300
 - -72% of owners = 900

Share Household Income Spent on Rent, Arlington County, 2010-2012




Share Household Income Spent on Select Owner Costs, Arlington County, 2010-2012




Share Household Income Spent on Rent, Arlington County, 2010-2012



Share Household Income Spent on Select Owner Costs, Arlington County, 2010-2012




Share Household Income Spent on Rent, Arlington County, 2010-2012




Share Household Income Spent on Rent, Arlington County, 2010-2012

 Are out-migrant households more likely to be lower or higher income?


 After they move out of Arlington, are they more likely to be renters or owners?

What do we know about people who moved out of Arlington?


- Are out-migrant households more likely to be lower or higher income?
 - They are more likely to have incomes between \$60,000 and \$149,999 than those who stay in Arlington
- After they move out of Arlington, are they more likely to be renters or owners?
 - They are more likely to rent than those who stay

Moved to Outside the Region






Share of Out-Migrant Households by Tenure, 2010-2012
