Objective: Ensure low- and moderate-income individuals and families can access housing.

Access: Displacement Policies



Avoid displacement of low-income residents out of the community during construction and redevelopment of CAF projects.

For private projects, encourage owners/developers to provide assistance to displaced tenants and provide County technical assistance to affected tenants.



Objective:

Prevent and end homelessness

- Housing first; shelter when necessary.
- Permanent Supportive Housing
- Prevention through safety net and services



Proactively pursue access to affordable housing for homeless individuals and families using an approach that centers on providing housing quickly. When temporary shelter is necessary as an interim step, provide individual housing-oriented services to move homeless persons to permanent housing as quickly as possible.

Average length of shelter stay < or = 30 days



Provide permanent supportive housing (PSH) for persons with disabilities who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness.

Goal of 425 PSH units with services by 2020

Prevent homelessness through safety net supports and social services to enable residents to maintain their housing.

Concentrate high-density residential within Metrorail corridors.

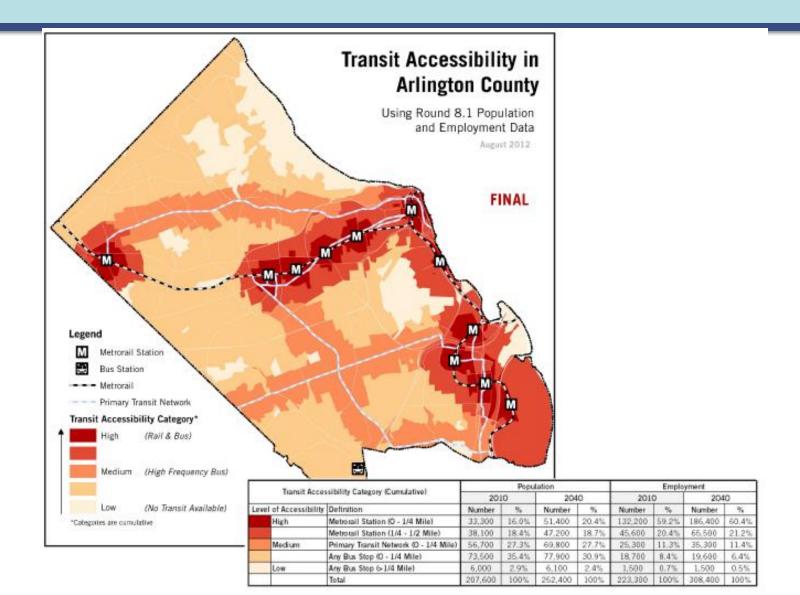
Increase the supply of housing by encouraging a variety of housing types in and near Metro Station Areas.

General Policy A
Integrate transportation with land use







Ensure that committed affordable rental units have high levels of access to transportation options consistent with the Master Transportation Plan and transitoriented development.



90% of rental CAFs will be located within ¼ mile of a primary transit network or within ½ mile of a Metrorail station.

All rental CAFs should be located at least within ¼ mile of a bus stop.
