Program at a Glance

- Program purpose is to provide rental assistance to low income households so that they can afford to live in Arlington
- Recipients are Arlington residents who meet income and asset requirements and are limited to working families with minor children, residents with disabilities, or residents age 65 or older
- Renters pay approximately 40% of household income toward rent; average monthly subsidy of \$580 covers remainder
- 100% locally funded; approximately 90% (1,105 households) live in committed affordable units
