

Old Fire Station No. 8

The Hall's Hill Volunteer Fire Department protected Hall's Hill - a historic African-American neighborhood in the northern part of Arlington County.

Hall's Hill is "situated on hand that was an antebellum estate" and "on number of current residents are descended from the estate's slave families," according to the web site arlingtonarts.org. The residents of Hall's Hill "conduced the era of segregation and the struggle for civil rights," the web site said.

Dotil the early 1960s, the Arlington County Fire Department was also segregated and only black firefighters - paid and volunteer - were assigned to old Station No. A.

The old station was replaced in 1963 by the current firehouse, which is located adjacont to the site of the old structure.



Historical Perspective of Response Time & Automatic Mutual Aid Response


Fire Extinguished Combat - Fire department applies extinguishing agent to fire, looks for victims, and searches for fire extension. **Vertical Response – Crew proceeds** to fire location with equipment. This Setup Time - Fire department arrives, pulls hose lines, establishes water may require significant time at a supply, etc. high rise or in structures with large setbacks from the curb. **Drive Time** – Begins when the fire department's appropriate apparatus leaves the station and ends when it arrives at the scene. Closing Remarks

- Several petitions have been circulated through canvassing and social media, with the majority of respondents supporting keeping FS8 where it is, and providing necessary resources Arlington citizens have the right to expect equipment, staff, and facilities to support a 3-bay station.
- Adverse operational impacts will occur if FS8 is moved:
 - farther North to an area that has experienced very little change in the past 50 years;
 - which historically experienced the lowest number of fire responses;
 - away from the first-duty area that receives 4xmore calls, with plans for HH/HVP expansion and Lee Highway corridor redevelopment;
 - while increasing the workload for FS2, the second busiest engine company that also serves Virginia Hospital Center;
 - while increasing more service to Fairfax County under the Mutual Aid Response Agreement; and while decreasing availability to Arlington County citizens, homes, and businesses.
- The appropriate way to honor the legacy of those men who dedicated their lives to serve and save their families and neighbors, committed and dedicated to a community segregated under Jim Crow as volunteers for a decade more than other ACFD White firefighters were being paid, is by bringing FS8 up to 21st century standards for professional careers in firefighting, emergency medical, and public services – end the benign neglect.
